INFORMATION RELATED TO THE MEGHALAYA INSTITUTE OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP (MIE)

Promotion of natural resource based micro enterprises is seen as a definitive growth driver for the state. A paradigm shift in thinking and strategy on development is sought to be brought about by moving away from a beneficiary oriented model to an enterprise promotion model. The belief is that citizens of the state can become successful entrepreneurs if the state creates a conducive eco system for enterprise building which involves a systematic engagement with existing and aspiring entrepreneurs of the state, providing for skill building and technology up gradation, access to finance, access to markets and development of value chains. Meghalaya has redefined entrepreneurship by choosing to view every individual of the state who produces anything for the market as an entrepreneur. To bring about such a paradigm shift the Meghalaya Institute of Entrepreneurship (MIE) is positioned to be the Nodal institution in the State for facilitating rapid economic transformation through entrepreneurship education and promotion of micro enterprises involving the youth, women and other critical target groups in the State. In this regard, MIE is striving to be amongst the very best in the area of entrepreneurship creation and promotion, innovation and application of skills, technologies and harnessing the rich entrepreneurial potential of promising sub sectors with clearly defined focus on apiculture, agriculture, horticulture, floriculture, pisciculture, aromatic and medicinal plantations, animal husbandry, nonfarm enterprises and other locally viable, remunerative income generating activities.

Apart from developing its own resource base, the institute also actively leverages upon the infrastructure, technical and institutional support available with local and national institutes like the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), State Polytechnics / Industrial Training Institutes, Academic Institutions, SIRD, NIRD, IIMS, IIHM, NIFT, Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDI), National Research Centre for Piggery (NRCP), YSP University of Horticulture & Forestry, Himachal Pradesh, Central Agricultural University (CAU), Imphal, University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS), Bangalore, KVKs etc for conducting its activities. Once fully developed, the Institute may also cater to the demands from other States having similar kinds of entrepreneurship development programmes.

OBJECTIVES OF MIE

- I. Map the business potential and create awareness among various target groups on entrepreneurial opportunities.
- II. To help and assist unemployed youth educated and uneducated, urban and rural in acquiring skills for self employment.
- III. To organize vocational training for skills up-gradation including establishment of vocational training centres.
- IV. To spread entrepreneurial education at the school and college level.
- V. To encourage and assist in setting up of enterprises by individuals focusing on first generation entrepreneurs through appropriate training, behavioral motivation, Managerial competencies and selective technical skilling.
- VI. To facilitate, inspire and handhold budding natural resource based enterprises in the pre incubation stage and as the ecosystem develops, to take them to the incubation and seed funding phase.

- VII. To map the business potential and opportunities of the state within a sustainable framework.
- VIII. Provide knowledge support to line departments and individuals through the encouragement and promotion of research & special studies on various aspects of entrepreneurship for small & medium enterprises, market surveys, potentiality surveys, technical feasibility and economic viability studies.
 - IX. To develop resource maps of Meghalaya and other client States for guidance and reference by aspiring entrepreneurs.
 - X. Provide backend support to line departments and entrepreneurs through leveraging help/support and affiliations with institutions/organizations in carrying out training and other entrepreneurship development related activities.
 - XI. To provide vital information and backend support to trainers, promoters and entrepreneurs by organizing research and documentation relevant to entrepreneurship development.
- XII. To provide regional / national/ international forums for interaction and exchange of experiences helpful for policy formulation and modification at various levels.

In pursuance of its objectives the MIE supports the Enterprise Facilitation Centers (EFC) and the Basin Development Units (BDU) in creation of an ecosystem to support enterprise and self employment growth through training, capacitating and hand-holding potential entrepreneur partners who have registered themselves in the EFCs and who are desirous of improving their livelihoods and are willing to invest their time, labor and money to start an enterprise. The MIE also supports line departments in the strategizing, implementation and roll out of specific mission interventions geared towards entrepreneurship and that too upon request from the departments concerned. As a demand based organization with limited resources the MIE does not give grants and has no developmental schemes to implement on its own except for training, capacity building and enterprise ecosystem creation and promotion. Partners are recommended by the EFCs to the BDUs for training which are then routed to the MIE for mobilization of technical and training resources. In keeping with its mandate as a resource, support and training institution, the MIE encourages departments and other agencies of the Government to take center stage and ownership of programmes and missions while supporting them from behind through trainings and capacity building.

Since its inception in 2011 the Meghalaya Institute of Entrepreneurship (MIE) has been able to impact more than **47,000** partners / citizens /officials/entrepreneurs across the State through various interventions like trainings, exposure visits, workshops, seminars, melas and events across various sectors like Livestock, Sericulture, Apiculture, aquaculture, handicraft, financial awareness, enterprise promotion, business development, livelihood promotion, processing and other nonfarm activities.

A number of partnerships have also been established both with national agencies like NIRD, Guwahati, NRCP, Assam, IIE, Guwahati, EDI, Ahmedabad, UAS Bangalore, CAU, Imphal, YSP University, Solan, CARD-KVK Kerala, Digital India Corporation, New Delhi, IRMA, Gujarat and international agencies like World Bank and IFAD. Partnerships with local entrepreneur promoted institutions have also been institutionalized and eight of the top developmental NGOs of the state have been trained in collaboration with the Institute of Livelihood Research & Training, (ILRT) which are now working in partnership with the District Basin Development Units (BDUs) and the EFCs to extend the outreach of livelihood and enterprise development programmes to the people.

The interventions of MIE are focused mainly on the following areas:

- 1. Capacity building and training
- 2. Back end support to enterprises and line departments
- 3. Knowledge backstopping for enterprises / entrepreneurs and line departments
- 4. Sector specific facilitation services

A. CAPACITY BUILDING AND TRAINING

The prime mandate of the MIE is capacity building and training of partners, officials, entrepreneurs, personnel of the Basin Development Units (BDUs), the Enterprise Facilitation Centres (EFCs) and NGO personnel engaged in the promotion of livelihoods and enterprises at the grassroots. To this end the MIE has trained and exposed 47,296 people from all sectors and domains in the following major fields:

Under the above activity heads the MIE has been able to achieve the following:

- a) 1402 partners trained in farm based enterprises.
- b) 1270 partners trained in Nonfarm enterprises
- c) 1300 partners and officials sent for exposure visit
- d) 30,255 partners capacitated and sensitized through workshops/ seminars/ conclaves / melas on various topics
- e) 3108 partners trained in livestock enterprises
- f) 7402 partner trained and skilled in bee keeping
- g) 1411 officials trained and capacitated in Management, Leadership and packaging.
- h) 851 personnel of the BDUs / IBDLP trained in various aspects of livelihood and enterprise promotion, financial inclusion, mapping, FBEI, banking processes etc.
- i) 297 NGO personnel trained in enterprise incubation and handholding.
- j) 98 enterprises incubated and taken to commercial and semi commercial production.

With a view to providing the best of knowledge, incubation and capacity to partners, the MIE has entered into technical and collaborative MoUs with institutes of higher learning like IRMA, Gujarat, NIRD-NERC, Guwahati, Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati and Digital India Corporation (DIC) and has partnered with the CARD-KVK Kerala, University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS), Bangalore, the Central Agricultural University (CAU), Imphal, World Bank, ILRT, AFC India etc for resources and technical support in addition to its own in-house faculty. As part of knowledge dissemination and sharing the MIE has also conducted and helped to conduct workshops, exposure visits, seminars, melas, conclaves, awareness programmes on various topics either on its own or in partnership with various State and National level organizations.

Notable examples of partners' achievements under this intervention are:

- 42 budding and established entrepreneurs have undergone MIE Master Classes conducted yearly in collaboration with the IEF Foundation, a non profit group of captains of industry. 35 entrepreneurs / enterprises have graduated from these classes and one of them, the Centre of Learning Knowledge and Services (COLKS) has been awarded the Top 5 social start up in the country by ISB Hyderabad and SAP India- 2017-18 and adjudged as the best business pitch in the precursor event of GES 2017 making the entrepreneur and his enterprise eligible for Series A funding upto 5.00 million dollars. Another graduate of the Master Classes was awarded two bronze category awards in the WOW Awards Asia 2017 and is now a national member of the Event & Entertainment Management Association (EEMA) of India with a turnover of Rs. 7.00 crores
- Financial literacy trainings and awareness programmes conducted with World Bank assistance in 44 villages across the state and impacting out to 1643 households.

- 513 officers of the Agriculture, Veterinary, C&RD departments trained and exposed to Envisioning, Management and Leadership by the Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA) and capacitated to become future leaders.
- 12,000 kg of honey produced and sold by 31 honey enterprises motivated and trained by the MIE. Of them the Centre of Learning, Knowledge and Services (COLKS) has launched the Bee Natural brand of Meghalaya honey for the premium market and is now exporting Meghalaya Honey to Singapore and Berlin with shelf presence in Foodhall, Delhi, Gourmet Store, Bengaluru, Super Dry Fruits, Hyderabad, 5 & 4 Star Hotel Chain (Kenilworth, Rajdhani Regency, Temi House, Mayfair). Similarly other entrepreneurs like A-chik Honey, Blossom, Wild Nectar and the Tyrnai Cooperative Society have found buyers within the state and on ecommerce platforms.
- With market and network facilitation of MIE, local enterprises like Country Spices, Smoky Falls Tribe Coffee, Jingjaw Umbarit Coop have been able to exploit and penetrate outside markets either through the ecommerce platform or offline retail.
- Smti. Daplin Rymbai of Jingjaw Umbarit Cooperative Society was recommended by the MIE and won the Women Entrepreneur of North East Award 2017 from FICCI FLO. Smti Dasumarlin Majaw of Smoky Falls Coffee has been selected as a nominee for the NE Woman entrepreneur of the year 2018.
- The Sengborlang Women SHG of Umladkhur have now switched to more hygienic production of smoked fish using COFISKI kilns through the training, exposure and facilitation of the MIE in collaboration with the DRDA, Jowai and CIFT, Vishakhapatnam. With enhanced shelf life due to the new technology they are now exploring markets outside the state for their delicacy.
- 393 partners trained in jackfruit value addition. Two entrepreneurs in the Garo Hills, Shri. Perastill R. Sangma, Smt. Baldilla T. Sangmaand Syntung cooperative society now producing jackfruit squash, chips, flakes and mixture after training by the MIE in collaboration with CARD-KVK, Kerala, UAS, Bangalore and the College of Home Sciences, Tura.
- One Master Trainer, Shri. James Evantis Dkhar, who was incubated and trained by the MIE has set up his own weaving, training and production unit with a loan and is now engaged in the production of the Flying8 loom and fabrics from Eri, Muga and Ramie along with 30 other weavers.
- COLKS has launched the MAD Essentials range of natural cosmetics from Shillong and is executing orders of minimum 10,000 pieces per month.
- 14 partners have set up pig breeding units from their own funds and two of them are now perhaps the biggest producers of crossbred and local piglets in the state.
- Shri. Demingstar Ranee of Mawphlang block and trained in apiculture by the MIE has expanded his apiary from 10 hives to almost 100 hives and is earning a comfortable income both from sale of honey and multiplication of queen bees.

- MIE has also incubated Meghalaya's first cheese manufacturer, Pine Hills Creamery, through the Master Class, which is now in commercial production.
- With training and handholding support from the MIE other entrepreneurs have started their own bakeries, home stays, tourism destinations, restaurants, studios, ice cream factory etc

B. BACKEND SUPPORT TO ENTERPRISES AND LINE DEPARTMENTS

- Development of a Monitoring Evaluation Tool & Information System (METIS) for tracking the progress of partners facilitated under the program
- Development, implementation and rollout of a Psychometric analysis tool using Focused Behavioral Event Interview (FBEI) for profiling of partners in collaboration with the ILRT.
- Cluster mapping for squash in collaboration with the Enterprise Development Institute of India (EDII), Gujarat and the SIRD
- Facilitating the SIRD in mapping of enterprise / Business opportunities in Meghalaya
- Technical and financial support for workshops, trainings, exposure visits and seminars of all BDUs
- Facilitating testing and certification for entrepreneurs' products like honey, turmeric, ginger etc
- Facilitating the GI registration of Lakadong Turmeric.
- Facilitating product and packaging design for products of the trained entrepreneurs and departments.
- Facilitating market mapping, entry and customer acquisition
- Facilitating sourcing of local products for enterprises both within and outside the State.
- Networking with big buyers and facilitating trade negotiations on behalf of local enterprises.
- Training on PRA and livelihood mapping exercises for the BDUs
- Mobilization of technical resources for departments, BDUs and EFCs
- Facilitating the linkage of cashew farmers with buyers outside the state.
- Livelihood mapping training for BDU personnel
- Facilitating the access of 678 partners to MUDRA loans worth Rs. 2.24 crores through the EFCs.
- Facilitating in spreading awareness on Integrated Village Cooperative Societies (IVCS) to 145 villages and 1729 partners prior to handing over to Financial Services Division of MBMA
- Development and standardization of the Meghalaya modified Type B bee boxes
- Development and standardization of clay / cement hives and honey extractors.
- 4,193 beekeeping households surveyed to facilitate the setting up of high value honey value chain clusters across the state. Of these 369 households have been trained in value addition.
- Assisting the Commerce & Industries Department in the procurement and distribution of 18,045 modern bee hives, 10,210 beehive stands and 5,200 HDPE honey containers to bee keepers to upgrade traditional beekeeping infrastructure.

- Facilitating the activation and operationalizing of the honey processing plant of the MKVIB in Nongpoh.
- Facilitating and incubating the establishment of apiculture training centres in the state.
- Facilitating the Commerce & Industries Department in the technical evaluation and inspection of the honey processing unit in Shillong.
- Facilitating the Commerce & Industries Department in the training and activation of the departmental carpentry units at district level.
- Facilitating the Commerce & Industries Department in the conduct of Business interactive session on beekeeping for 1,411 beekeepers.
- Quality certification for small scale apiculture equipment manufacturers.
- Facilitating the Department of Agriculture and the Meghalaya Small Farmers Agri Business Consortium (MgSFAC) in conceptualizing, development and implementation of 1917iTEAMS, a first of its kind disruptive, market oriented, farmer centric and cloud based integrated advisory, logistics and transparent buyer seller platform accessible through a single toll free number -1917.
- Facilitating and handholding the Department of AH & Veterinary in the rollout and implementation of Livestock Development Centres (LDC) which are primary veterinary units at the cluster and village level that will bring paid veterinary healthcare and feed services to the doorstep of the farmer while generating tremendous self employment opportunities for educated rural youths. The MIE has also assisted the department in the activation of 3 (three) Vocational Training Centres (VTC) in Williamnagar, Manai and Upper Shillong.
- Facilitating the Department of Agriculture in the post harvest development of Ramie fibre into fabric through local entrepreneurs and showcasing the new fabric to potential buyers and industries in collaboration with the Embassy of France.
- Facilitating the Department of AH & Veterinary in forging an agreement with Belgium for livestock and dairy related technical interventions.
- Facilitating the DRDA and BDU, Jowai in the identification and mobilization of technical resources for smoked fish entrepreneurs, tourism operators, fruit processors and turmeric growers.
- Facilitating the East Khasi Hills District Milk Union to leverage financial resources from the Ministry of Agriculture to the tune of Rs. 11.00 crores and training the members of the Union such that the Union is now capable and has taken over the Milk Chilling and processing plant in Mawiong which has benefited dairy farmers of the district tremendously.
- Facilitating the conduct of workshops, seminars, bid processes etc for departments.

C. KNOWLEDGE BACKSTOPPING FOR ENTERPRISES / ENTREPRENEURS AND LINE DEPARTMENTS

- Formulation of project reports, mission documents, strategy papers, guidelines, agreements etc for line departments like Commerce & industries, AH & Veterinary, Horticulture/Agriculture, Sericulture, Cooperation, Meghaloom etc.
- Livelihood mapping studies for Amlarem, Selsella, Pynursla, Mawthadraishan, Betasing, Resubelpara & Gasuapara blocks in collaboration with the ILRT and BDUs.

- Sub sector studies in poultry, piggery, bay leaf, oranges, Cashew, arecanut in collaboration with the ILRT and BDUs
- Livelihood mapping & PRA exercise on sand mining Laitkroh, Mawryngkneng, Mylliem & Mawphlang C&RD Blocks in collaboration with the Meghalaya Institute of Governance (MIG) and the BDU.
- Development and publication of training manuals and pocket Z Cards in apiculture, piggery fattening, breeding, Dairy, Poultry, leadership management, Business fundamentals etc. 4 lakh pocket-sized Apiculture and Livestock Z-Card training manuals developed and distributed to traditional beekeepers and livestock farmers across the state.
- Study on Cement and clay bee hives in Mawthawtieng, Mawpran and Mooshrot villages.
- Formulation of a Bee floral calendar in collaboration with institutions of higher learning. 2475 local bee forage plants listed.
- Conduct of sample surveys of meat retailers and dairy demand and supply in Shillong, Tura, Jowai, Williamnagar, Garobadha, Ampati, Mendipathar, Resubelpara
- Creation of Business plans for livestock enterprises with private sector funding.
- Sourcing of technology and protocols for jackfruit processing, sweet and ice cream making
- Supporting potential entrepreneurs to be certified through short term college run Entrepreneurship Development Programmes (EDP) like the UGC sponsored 3 months EDP of the Shillong College.

D. SECTOR SPECIFIC FACILITATION SERVICES

- Assisting and facilitating the Meghalaya State Rural Livelihoods Society (MSRLS) of the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) in the rollout, handholding and incubation of nonfarm entrepreneurs of the Startup Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP) in Mairang block.
- Facilitating the rollout and incubation of honey based enterprises under the Apiculture Mission in collaboration with Commerce & Industries Department, MKVIB and KVIC.
- Facilitating the design, strategy and formation of the Meghalaya Piggery and Livestock Development Society (MPLDS)
- Facilitating the design, rollout, strategy and implementation of 1917iTEAMS on behalf of the Department of Agriculture and the MgSFAC.
- Facilitating the market entry and product design of ramie based products under the Natural Fibers Mission in collaboration with the Embassy of France.
- Facilitating the rollout and implementation of the Livestock Development Centers (LDC) under the MeghaLAMP in collaboration with AH & Vety Department.

E. INSTITUTIONAL PARTNERSHIPS OF MIE

As part of its objectives to be the premier institution of the state in the area of entrepreneurship creation and promotion, innovation and application of skills, technologies through harnessing the rich potential of promising sub sectors and to fulfil its mandate of facilitating rapid economic transformation through

entrepreneurship education and promotion of micro enterprises involving the youth, women and other critical target groups in the State, the Meghalaya Institute of Entrepreneurship (MIE) has established linkages and partnerships with a varied cross section of institutions both public and private to take its objectives and mandate forward some of which are detailed below.

- 1. Institute of Livelihood Research & Training (ILRT): The ILRT, Shillong, is the leading institution with which the MIE has partnered with to provide capacity building and accompaniment support to the personnel of IBDLP right down to the grassroots. The ILRT takes livelihood promotion knowledge from the field and develops it into structured lessons that can be disseminated to practitioners of livelihood promotion in the form of training and capacity building programs which are primarily centered on capacitating IBDLP personnel especially those in the BDUs and EFCs to enhance their implementation capacity. This is being done through a structured modular training schedule which comprises of:
 - a) Achievement Motivation Training (AMT)
 - b) Fundamentals of Livelihood Promotion I & II (FLP)
 - c) Focused Behavioural Event Interview (FBEI)
 - d) Assessment of Entrepreneurial Competencies and Training Methodologies

With the empanelment of the 8 local NGOs to act as the last mile outreach arms of the EFCs, the role of ILRT has been expanded to include trainings for the personnel of these NGOs on the same modules as for IBDLP personnel.

ILRT has also organized exposure visits of Enterprise Resource Personnel to the State Poverty Eradication Mission (SPEM), Kerala also known as Kudumbashree during 2013-2014 to provide a first-hand exposure to convergence and community led enterprises.

As part of the accompaniment support measure the ILRT team is assisting the EFC teams in assessment of the entrepreneur's requests, develop entrepreneurial plans, establishment of collaborations for productivity enhancement, financial linkages, forward and backward linkages and other support required for enterprise promotion.

ILRT has also conducted a number of livelihood mapping exercises and value chain studies with the EFC teams.

2. AFC India Pvt. Ltd, Department of Commerce & Industry, Meghalaya Khadi & Village Industries Board: The MIE has been guiding AFC India Pvt. Ltd. to train beekeepers and to assist the MIE in its role as a Technical Advisory institution for the Department of Commerce & Industries (DCI) which is the Nodal Department for Apiculture and to the MKVIB which is the marketing wing of the DCI. Under this partnership the focus over the last two years has been on building up the capacity of the department to own and run the Apiculture Mission and to train beekeepers and entrepreneurs identified both by the BDUs and the Dept. in scientific beekeeping with the ultimate objective of leveraging the rich natural resources of the state to catalyze the growth of Apiculture as an enterprise. The combined efforts of the 4 entities has resulted in the skill Upgradation of 7402 beekeepers, activation of 6 carpentry and 2 SSI units, training of departmental officers, 31 entrepreneurs and 195 master beekeepers, standardization of scientific Meghalaya Type B bee hives, mapping of 4000+ beekeeping households, activation of 3

- honey processing plants, reactivation of 4 DCIC workshops, development of customized training & IEC materials and the establishment of 3 (three) apiculture training centres in the State.
- 3. <u>University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore:</u> The MIE has partnered with the University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS), Bangalore and more specifically with the Division of Apiculture as a technical and knowledge backstopping resource institution for the Apiculture Mission. Progressive beekeepers, master carpenters, processors and officials have been trained and exposed to the apiculture industry by the UAS. MIE has also partnered with the Department of Biotechnology, UAS, for training and capacity building in jackfruit processing for entrepreneurs especially those from the Garo Hills.
- 4. <u>Home Science College, Central Agriculture University, Tura:</u> The MIE along with the BDU, West Garo Hills and MIE, Tura, has partnered with the Home Science College, Tura, to train partners in jackfruit processing, cashew processing, pickle making etc. The college also serves as a common facility centre to assist partners in processing of their produce for sale.
- 5. <u>Central Silk Technological Research Institute (CSTRI), Bangalore:</u> MIE has partnered with the CSTRI for capacity building and training of weavers in various aspects of weaving, dyeing and post cocoon technology. A total of 32 partners have graduated from the CSTRI. Master trainers who have graduated are now conducting trainings in the districts on the request of the BDUs and one of them has now set up his own training and production unit with the latest technology from his own funds and a bank loan.
- 6. <u>Regional Silk Technological Research Station (RSTRS), Khanapara:</u> MIE has partnered with the RSTRS for training of weavers in dobby and jacquard and in the skill up gradation of partners especially those from the Garo Hills.
- 7. National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT), Shillong: NIFT has been associated with the MIE in the training of weavers and eri farmers in the field of textile designing and product diversification.
- 8. <u>CARD-KVK, Thiruvalla:</u> The CARD-KVK, Thiruvalla, has over the past three years been associated with the MIE in the training and capacity building of partners and entrepreneurs in value addition of jackfruit. 13 officials of the Cooperation and Industries departments have also been trained by the CARD-KVK. Post the training 3 partners are now producing jackfruit value added products.
- 9. <u>Indian Institute of Packaging (IIP), Kolkata and Mumbai:</u> The IIPs of both Kolkata and Mumbai have facilitated the training of partners and officials of the Industries, Horticulture and Veterinary departments in various aspects of packaging and shelf life testing.
- 10. <u>National Institute of Rural Development (NIRD)</u>, <u>Hyderabad</u>: MIE has partnered with the NIRD, Hyderabad, for exposure and training of our partners on the various SME options available through its Rural Technology Park (RTP). A total of 89 partners have been trained by the NIRD.
- 11. <u>National Dairy Development Board (NDDB)</u>: MIE had tied up with the NDDB for training and exposure of dairy partners to the Gujarat dairy model. 102 dairy farmers and 5 officials were trained by the NDDB while the exposure visits were facilitated by the ILRT.

- 12. <u>College of Veterinary Sciences, AAU, Khanapara:</u> MIE had facilitated the training of potential animal feed entrepreneurs in the College of Veterinary Sciences, Khanapara, in the field of feed formulation and scientific goat management. 14 partners have been trained in livestock feed formulation while 29 partners have been trained in goat management.
- 13. National Research Center for Pigs (NRCP): In view of the large scale demand for piggery the MIE has partnered with the NRCP, Rani to train partners in the scientific slaughter of pigs and value addition of pork. Close to a hundred partners, primarily local butchers, have been trained in NRCP and post the training have reported that they are now able to get 1.5 kgs extra meat per pig due to the training.
- 14. **Central Institute of Fishery Education (CIFE), Kolkata:** MIE had facilitated the training of 40 partners of SWKH in the CIFE, Kolkata.
- 15. Central Institute of Fisheries Technology (CIFT), Vishakhapatnam and State Institute of Fisheries Technology (SIFT), Kakinada: Responding to a request from the BDU, West Jaintia Hills, the MIE had initiated a tie up with the CIFT and the SIFT for training of 120 smoked fish entrepreneurs and 4 officials of WJH in advanced low cost and hygienic preparation of smoked fish. Post the training a follow up program was facilitated by MIE in collaboration with the DRDA and BDU, WJH, in which scientists from CIFT participated and gifted various processing and fishing equipment to the partners. In addition the MIE also arranged for a specific training for the partners in Food Safety and Hygiene in the Indian Institute of Hotel Management (IIHM), Shillong to complete their exposure.
- 16. <u>Indian Institute of Hotel Management (IIHM), Shillong:</u> In order to address the issues of food safety of smoked fish and spoilage of milk reported by the Dairy Cooperative Societies, the MIE had tied up with the IIHM, Shillong, to impart training to partners in these 2 sectors. While 23 partners were trained in Food safety & hygiene, 11 partners were trained in the making of sweets, ice cream, butter and other dairy by products. Further trainings covering other aspects of food processing are also planned.
- 17. <u>Regional Rural Training Institute (RRTC), Umran:</u> The MIE in collaboration with the Department of Commerce & Industries and AFC India had collaborated with the RRTC, Umran, to train traditional beekeepers in scientific beekeeping and earthen hives. A total of 2224 beekeepers have been trained by the RRTC and AFC India.
- 18. <u>State Rural Employment Society (SRES):</u> The SRES had partnered with the MIE in facilitating the training of piggery entrepreneurs through mobilization of interested VEC members. Trainings were conducted by MIE in collaboration with the SIRD and a total of 229 partners have been trained through this partnership.
- 19. <u>Vocational Training Centers (VTCs), Kyrdemkulai and Rongkhon:</u> Under a partnership with the AH& Vety Department, the MIE had facilitated the rollout of 10 days training each of livestock partners in VTC, Kyrdemkulai and in VTC, Rongkhon in piggery, dairy and poultry enterprises. The training content of the VTCs has been modified to incorporate elements of book keeping,

insurance and bank linkages in order to impart the necessary enterprise management skill to the partners.

- 20. <u>Veterinary Field Assistant Training Institute (VFA), Kyrdemkulai:</u> MIE has also partnered with the VFA training institute, Kyrdemkulai to train 23 livestock Master Trainers drawn from the CLFs and shortlisted by the VTCs. These Master trainers were further trained by the NRCP and are now imparting trainings to partners in the Centre of Learning Knowledge and Services (COLKS), Mylliem, Mawlai and Bolmoram.
- 21. <u>Center of Learning Knowledge and Services (COLKS), Mawlai & Mylliem:</u> MIE has partnered with the COLKS, an institute founded by a group of entrepreneurs of the Mylliem EFC, who have established the institute from their own funds to provide an environment for capacity building and training in the field of Apiculture, Livestock and nonfarm activities. A total of 153 livestock partners and 2979 apiculture partners have been trained at COLKS by resource persons drawn from departments, private entrepreneurs and in house resources.
- 22. <u>Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI)</u>: MIE had partnered with the FSSAI, Shillong, to impart training on food safety and standards especially to partners dealing with food products. The initial engagements with FSSAI has been in training of livestock partners at COLKS with the association expected to stretch further to cover all other food products.
- 23. <u>State Institute for Rural Development (SIRD):</u> MIE had a partnership with SIRD in which VEC members selected by the SRES for taking up piggery related activities were trained by the MIE and SIRD. SIRD also has facilitated the rollout of the Diploma in Entrepreneurship and Business Management (DEBM), a one year course of the Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII), Ahmedabad, for 69 ERPs of the BDUs.
- 24. <u>State Poverty Eradication Mission (SPEM), Kudumbashree:</u> MIE has partnered with the NRO of the SPEM for exposure of its functionaries and officials to the Kudumbashree initiative. With the facilitation of the ILRT, 41 officials were exposed to the best practices of the Kudumbashree initiative.
- 25. <u>NIRD-NERC and IIE, Guwahati:</u> MIE had entered into agreements with the NIRD-NERC and the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE) for training and capacity building of partners and officials. Trainings have been conducted on a regular basis for partners of Garo Hills.
- 26. <u>Meghalaya State Rural Livelihoods Society (MSRLS):</u> In response to a request of the MSRLS, MIE had screened and forwarded the profiles of 66 partners across various sectors for linking and training them under the RSETIs of the MSRLS. MIE is also assisting the MSRLS in the rollout of the SVEP under an MoU.
- 27. <u>Digital India Corporation:</u> As part of its facilitation to the department of Agriculture, the MIE had entered into an MoU with Digital India Corporation (DIC), Ministry of Electronics and IT, for support to the 1917iTEAMS project of the department.
- 28. <u>Central Agricultural University (CAU), Imphal</u>: In order to provide the best scientific and advisory services to farmers of the state, the MIE is working on a MoU with the CAU to leverage on the

combined scientific and technical resources of all 13 agriculture, forestry, horticulture, fishery, home science, post graduate and veterinary colleges of the North East which fall under the ambit of the CAU for support to the 1917iTEAMS initiative of the Government and to farmers of the state.

- 29. <u>Shillong College</u>: The MIE has partnered with the Shillong College sponsor and train potential entrepreneurs through the 3 months UGC approved EDP course being offered by the College. A total of 4 batches have been trained by the College.
- 30. <u>IEF Foundation</u>: The MIE in partnership with the IEF Foundation runs pro bono business development Master Classes for budding and established higher end entrepreneurs to equip them with the skill sets for survival success in the early years of their venture. The Master Classes are anchored and taught by Captains of Industry and successful entrepreneurs from all over the country who give their time and knowledge freely to teach and mentor young entrepreneurs of the state. The Master Classes also has a mentorship component wherein each entrepreneur who graduates is handheld and mentored after graduation by specialist in their field of business. 35 entrepreneurs have graduated the classes and have gone on to establish their businesses while another 7 are still to graduate.
- **31.** <u>Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA):</u> The MIE has entered into an agreement with IRMA for conduct of an off campus Management Leadership Development Programme (MLDP) for officials of line departments. The programme is being conducted by the Director of IRMA himself and a total of 263 officers have been successfully trained under this programme.
- **32.** <u>Department of AH & Veterinary</u>: The Department of AH & Veterinary had entered into an agreement with MIE to launch and rollout the Livestock Development Centres (LDC) of the MeghaLAMP and for activation of its 3 VTCs of Manai, Williamnagar and Upper Shillong for training of livestock farmers.
- **33.** <u>Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture & Forestry, Nauni, Solan</u>: The MIE has partnered with the YSP University to train 20 Master Beekeepers in the rapid multiplication of queen bees which is a potentially very lucrative source of supplemental income for beekeepers.


